Racial Justice Sunday

'The most important one is this, 'Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength'. The second is this: 'Love your neighbour as yourself,' There is not commandment greater than these.' Mark 12: 28 – 31

'Jesus calls on his followers not to 'tolerate' or even 'accept' their neighbours, but to love them, regardless of how they look or what they believe. This is not an easy ask, but it is one that is demanded of those who follow a Saviour who gave his life for all, out of love.

Becoming a fairer church

'Mighty king, who loves justice, you have established equity; you have executed justice and righteousness in Jacob.' Psalm 99: 4

How remarkable to hear about a king who loves justice. Many speak about justice, or appreciate it or are glad to experience it, but God's king loves it. Jesus Christ, for he is the king the Psalm ultimately points to, is not bound by any laws or expectations, only by his own character, and his heart is set on justice. What does this mean? Our skewed human preference is for the rich and the powerful: in contrast the justice of God leans towards the marginalised, the weak and the vulnerable. Our prayer for the churches of the diocese is that we too would all lean this way, in imitation of God and his king. He will bring his justice one day and we seek to live in anticipation of that, changed into his likeness, from glory to glory.

Almighty Father,
whose Son was revealed in majesty
before he suffered death upon the cross,

gives us grace to perceive his glory,
that we may be strengthened to suffer with him
and be changed into his likeness,
from glory to glory;
who is alive and reigns with you,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,

'The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it.' Genesis 2:15

At the start of Lent our readings remind us of our human origins. Our struggle to treat this world rightly is a symptom of our struggle to be truly human: we see the consequences in the climate crisis and in the many ways that the natural world is abused. When the church becomes greener it is showing its desire to live in obedience to God and with compassion for our neighbours. May this Lent be a time when we do this more and more.
